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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

The directors present their report and financial statements of Foresight Holdco 2 Ltd (the company) for the year ended 31 March 2024.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of being corporate member to Foresight Group LLP and VCF II LLP.

Dividends

No dividends will be distributed or proposed for the year ended 31 March 2024.

Going concern

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

The directors have considered the resilience of the company, taking into account its current financial position and the principal and emerging risks facing the business. As disclosed in the principal activity above, the company is corporate member to Foresight Group LLP ("FGLLP") from which the company receives a profit share which is the company's most significant income source. The directors have therefore reviewed the company's cash flow forecasts and trading budgets in conjunction with those of FGLLP for a period of 12 months from the date of approval of these accounts as part of its overall review of the company's and FGLLP's three year plan, and concluded that, taking into account plausible downside scenarios that could reasonably be anticipated, the company will have sufficient funds to pay its liabilities as they fall due for that period. Taking into consideration the wider economic environment, the forecasts have been stress tested to ensure that a robust assessment of the company's working capital and cash requirements has been performed. The stress test scenarios adopted involved severe but plausible downside scenarios which included a material reduction in revenues through 50% lower fundraising, 25% lower deployment and 10% reduction in valuation of the funds managed by FGLLP. Any mitigating actions available to protect working capital and strengthen the statement of financial position, including deferring non-essential capital expenditure and increased cost control, were also taken into account.

In considering the above, the directors have formed the view that the company will generate sufficient cash to meet its ongoing liabilities as they fall due for at least the next 12 months; accordingly, the going concern basis of preparation has been adopted.

VCF II has not been factored into the going concern review as this LLP itself is subject to support from FGLLP.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Company information

Foresight Holdco 2 Ltd is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The registered office is C/O Foresight Group LLP, The Shard, 32 London Bridge Street, London, SE1 9SG.

1.2. Accounting convention

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the 'Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland' ('FRS 102') and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.3. Exemption from preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about the company as an individual entity and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred by \$400 of the Companies Act 2006 not to produce consolidated financial statements as it is included in the consolidated accounts of Foresight Group Holdings Limited (see note 16).

1.4. Reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" as the disclosure below is included in the consolidated financial statements of the group in which the company is consolidated:

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

1.5. Going concern

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

The directors have considered the resilience of the company, taking into account its current financial position and the principal and emerging risks facing the business. As disclosed in the principal activity above, the company is corporate member to Foresight Group LLP ("FGLLP") from which the company receives a profit share which is the company's most significant income source. 1.6. Taxation

The tax expense for the period comprises current and deferred tax.

Current taxes are based on the results shown in the financial statements and are calculated according to local tax rules, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the date of the Statement of Financial Position.

1.7. Investments

Investments in other group undertakings are held at cost less impairment with any impairment recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

1.8. Financial instruments

Trade and other debtors/ trade and other creditors

Trade and other debtors are measured at the transaction price, less any impairment.

Trade and other creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

1.9 Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

Preparation of financial statements requires management to exercise judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of the company's accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and assumptions used in the preparation of the financial statements are continually reviewed and revised as necessary.

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The estimates and assumptions which have a significant risk of causing material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities are as follows:

Impairment of other investments in group undertakings

At each date of the Statement of Financial Position, the company reviews the carrying amounts of its investments to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any).

Where the asset does not generate cash flows that are independent from other assets, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belongs. Recoverable amount is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss is recognised as an expense immediately. At 31 March 2024, the recoverable amount of investments in subsidiaries is considered to equate to the carrying value and no impairment loss was recognised.
